## Definition of Bulk Waste Generator (BWG)

“Bulk Waste Generator (BWG)” means and includes buildings occupied by the Central government departments or undertakings, State government departments or undertakings, local bodies, public sector undertakings or private companies, hospitals, nursing homes, schools, colleges, universities, other educational institutions, hostels, hotels, commercial establishments, markets, places of worship, stadium and sports complexes having an average waste generation rate exceeding 100kg per day or having campus area 5,000 square meters or more.

- Field verification: 9<sup>th</sup> Jan 2025 to 20<sup>th</sup> Jan 2025 (11 days)
